The system identifies the pair to be contrasting through the affix-based seed pair *caring* (second word in paragraph 2 or category 423) and *uncaring* (fourth word in paragraph 3 or category 230). The paragraphs of *sympathetic* and *indifferent* are therefore the prime contrasting paragraphs and so all word pairs that have one word each from these two paragraphs are Class II contrasting pairs. All other pairs formed by taking one word each from the two contrasting categories are the Class III contrasting pairs. Paragraph heads are shown in bold italic.
